Fellowship Purpose

This fellowship is centered on uplifting survivors through supporting their desires to preserve and share their cultural arts. It recognizes the importance of cultural arts as a means of expressing identity, resilience, and the journey towards healing and empowerment. The program enables survivors to become public speakers and advocates, using their unique artistic expressions to raise awareness about modern slavery.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Applicants must show a educated understanding of Empowerment Collectives Mission and Vision
2. Applicants need to identify a cultural heritage art that they would like to study and become an expert on.
3. The applicant must be a survivor of modern slavery. This includes individuals who have personally experienced any form of modern slavery, such as human trafficking, forced labor, debt bondage, or similar exploitative situations.
4. The applicant can be a person with lived experiences of modern slavery. This encompasses individuals who, while not directly subjected to modern slavery themselves, have close personal experiences related to it, such as family members or significant others who have been affected.
5. The applicant may also be a person who has had extensive hands-on experience working with survivors or people with lived experiences of modern slavery. This includes professionals, advocates, or volunteers who have dedicated significant time and effort in support roles, providing assistance, counseling, or other forms of direct aid to survivors.
6. Demonstrated willingness to develop and share innovative ideas to end modern slavery.

Fellowship Benefits

Application Process
