Fellowship Purpose

Eligibility Criteria

3. The applicant must be a survivor of modern slavery. This includes individuals who have personally experienced any form of modern slavery, such as human trafficking, forced labor, debt bondage, or similar exploitative situations.
4. The applicant can be a person with lived experiences of modern slavery. This encompasses individuals who, while not directly subjected to modern slavery themselves, have close personal experiences related to it, such as family members or significant others who have been affected.
5. The applicant may also be a person who has had extensive hands-on experience working with survivors or people with lived experiences of modern slavery. This includes professionals, advocates, or volunteers who have dedicated significant time and effort in support roles, providing assistance, counseling, or other forms of direct aid to survivors.
6. Demonstrated willingness to develop and share innovative ideas to end modern slavery.

Application Process

- Submission of a detailed application form, outlining the applicant's background, experiences, and vision for their advocacy work.
- A proposal for a project or initiative they wish to lead or develop during the fellowship.
- References or endorsements from individuals or organizations familiar with the applicant's work and potential.

Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated resilience and strength in overcoming the challenges of modern slavery.
- A clear and compelling vision for their role as a public speaker and advocate.
- The potential for their proposed project or initiative to make a meaningful impact.

Program Commitments

- Active participation in mentorship and training programs provided by the Empowerment Collective.
